JOB RESPONSIBILITIES:

Under general direction of the Director of Environmental Health, the REHS or EHST is responsible for rendering and managing general professional public health specialist duties in licensed facilities, homes, and other community settings; performs related duties as required. Participate in public health emergency response as needed.

This position is primarily responsible for work in the Food, Pool, Body Art, and Smoke Free Workplace programs.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Position requires:

- A Baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university which meets the educational requirements in Ohio Administrative Code Section 4736.08. Please review the specific educational requirements prior to applying.
- A current and valid Registered Environmental Health Specialist or Environmental Health Specialist in Training
 license as issued by the Ohio Department of Health; or ability to become registered as a Specialist in Training.
 To be eligible, candidates should minimally possess 45-quarter hours or 30 semester hours of science courses
 approved by Ohio Department of Health, Environmental Health Specialist Board.
- A valid Ohio driver's license with own vehicle and ability to maintain a driving record that meets the insurability requirements of Miami County Public Health's insurance provider. A Miami County Public Health vehicle may be provided.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

Ability to conduct inspections, communicate effectively in written and oral form; resolve complaints from the general public; prepare meaningful, concise, and accurate reports; and use proper research methods in gathering data. Ability to educate operators and the general public.

Ability to write, issue and enforce violations in accordance with applicable laws and rules. Ability to work with people to obtain results to achieve compliance. Ability to work together with multiple agencies, including law enforcement. May be required to testify in court proceedings. May be required to respond to a complaint after regular business hours.

Knowledge of basic computer programs such as Word and Excel. Ability to enter findings into computer programs to produce documents. Knowledge of Healthspace preferred.

Knowledge of a variety of public health policies and environmental health programs is preferred.
