This report highlights information on contributing factors, frequency data on days of the week and time of day, gender, and average age, from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2021.

CRASH CONTRIBUTING FACTORS

Over the past few years, law enforcement has seen a significant increase in fatal crashes related to reckless driving behaviors. While there can be various contributing factors that impact fatal crashes, there are a few that occur more frequently than others. The top 5 contributing factors for fatal crashes in Miami County include:		
Alcohol/Drug:	14	
Failure to yield:	10	
Running stop sign/red light:	10	
Left of center:	10	
Speed:	9
